## ANDY JUNKIN AGRICULTURE STRATEGY

Andy Junkin's emphasis is helping farm  
and ranch families prevent turmoil.

Andy's stories about how he came to offer  
his services involve topics not usually in farm  
or ranch discussions around coffee shop  
tables or on farm and ranch conference  
agendas. Rather than commodity outlooks  
or fuel prices, the gist for his emphasis to  
create lasting legacies are divorce, suicide  
attempts, and shattered families.

The final push came when he saw a family  
fall apart at a wedding over a succession  
dispute and family members never spoke  
to each other again.

"I said the way we are doing succession  
planning has got to change," he said.

Since then, he has been helping family  
farms in Canada and North America  
improve the odds of a family's name being  
on the farm's mailbox for generations to  
come by getting everyone to focus on what  
matters.

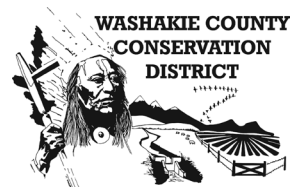
